## Part 2 - From Angers to La Rochelle

verte" Red : Loire Valley cycleway



Return to part 1 - Cherbourg to Angers

Page 1 - Angers to Saumur



Zoom on Angers - Exit Angers on one of the two cycleways linking to the Loire Valley cycleway (LV - EV6) . The route south to Bouchemaine is easier to follow, as it is dedicated cycleway geside the river Maine. Then head EAST in the direction of Saumur



As you enter **Saumur**, just after the Loire Veloroute crosses the river Thouet, leave the LV heading south on the **Thouet valley veloroute**, which will take you as far as **Parthenay**, via **Thouars**. This is a marked cycleway, a mix between dedicated cycle tracks and small byroads.






Angers - La Rochelle : Page 2 Saumur Thouars - Airvault - Thouet valleycycleway

## Angers - La Rochelle : Page 3 Airvault - Parthenay - Niort



Marked cycleway all the way as far as **Niort** - mostly using small byways. Pale blue: Thouet valley cycleway, **dark blue** Deux-Sèvres cycleway, Parthenay to Niort.

## ► After Niort:

The Cycleway exits **Niort** on the banks of the **Sèvre Niortaise** river. From **Magné** to Irleau ot follows small roads or tracks. At Irleau you rejoin the river, which is followed as far as **Marans**, where the V43 meets the Atlantic coastal cycleway, EV1, for a short final leg southwards to **La Rochelle**
